

ABSTRACT

Mary Hollowell, a certified science teacher, has written two book manuscripts about ecojustice advocacy, both of which are under consideration at publishing houses. They will build upon her prior education book titled The Forgotten Room: Inside a Public Alternative School for At-Risk Youth from Rowman & Littlefield. Not only has Hollowell written about ecojustice advocacy, but she has participated in the foundational groundwork of environmental activism for almost eight years. She has role modeled activism for students. Mary has spoken to many high school and church groups about the dangers of geoengineering, a pollution problem around the world. She has lobbied legislators, engaged celebrities, sponsored public service announcements, done mass mailing with children, and distributed thousands of informational flyers in major cities such as Atlanta, New Orleans, San Francisco, and Pittsburgh. Using Google Maps, Mary created the Anti-Geoengineering National Trail as a public record of advocacy. In addition, Dr. Hollowell has participated in creative, peaceful sidewalk protests against habitat destruction. She has manned an Earth Day booth alongside high school Adopt-a-Stream students and networked with former Riverkeeper and environmental lawyer Robert F.
